On Monday morning last there passed to its Maker the soul of Mrs. Angus McIsaac (nee McIntyre), Main Street, this town. It is only very recently that Mrs. McIsaac showed evidence of failing health. The community therefore, were hardly prepared to hear, on that morning, the sad news that the Grim Reaper had paid its inevitable visitor, and was in this household. The deceased lady, who was in her sixty-fifth year, was a loyal wife and a model Christian mother. What more could we add, or be desired? Her grief-stricken husband and family have with them the consolation that comes from abiding trust in the mercy of Him who disposes all things right. The internment took place Tuesday after a solemn High Mass of Requiem had been offered up for the repose of her soul. May she rest in peace.

Peter Paul MacIsaac Obit The Casket 48-1899-39-5

Sep 28 1899 Peter Paul MacIsaac, second son of Angus McIsaac, J.P. if this Town died in Butte, Montana on last Thursday in the forty first year of his age. About twelve years ago he left home to become a member of the Governor General's Foot Guards at Ottawa. After a short time in the area he joined the North West Mounted Police and was stationed for two years at Regina, North West Territory. Then he went to Montana where he was engaged in mining until he was struck down with pneumonia of which he died after a short illness. In his last moments he was consoled by the rites of the church. His remains are on the way home and his funeral will take place probably on Saturday. His bereaved Father and relatives have the sympathy of the community in their loss. May he Rest in Peace
